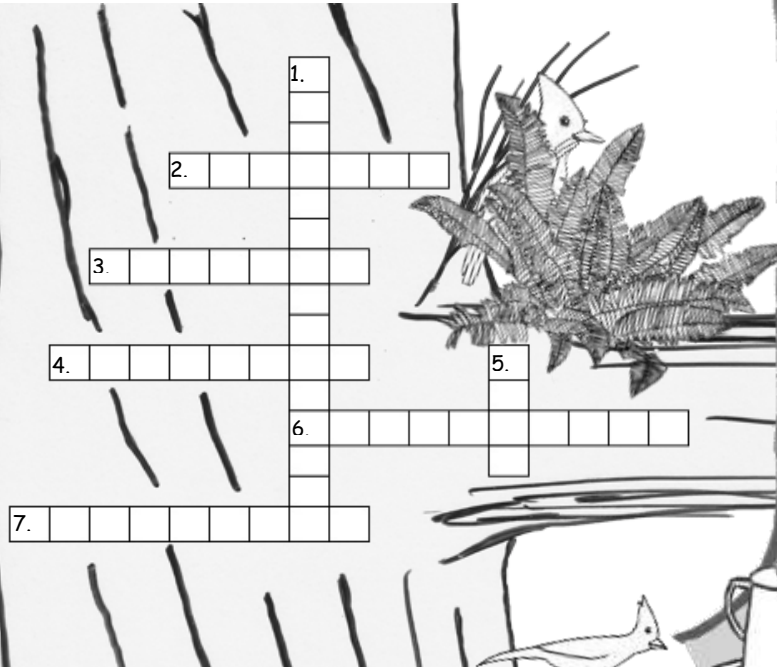

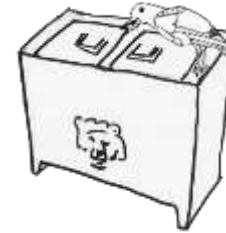

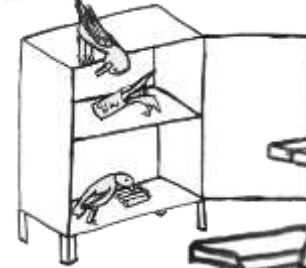

My chick must travel many miles from our tree and make it all the way to the ocean on its first flight.

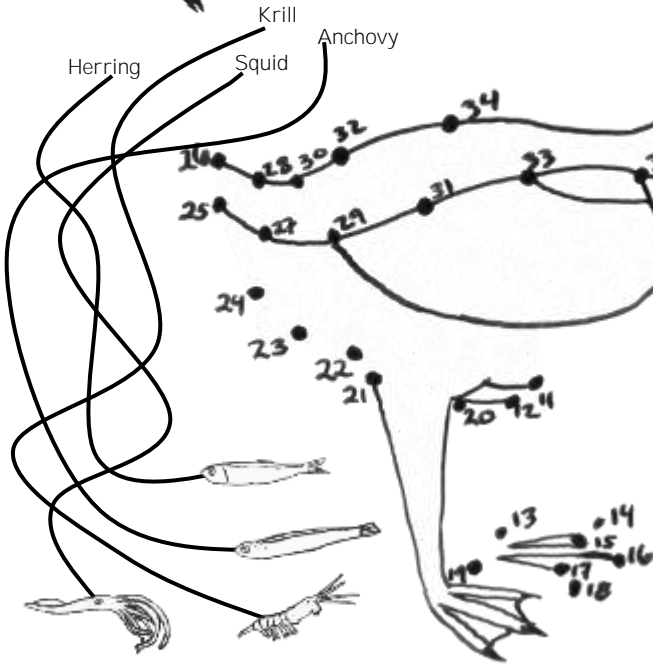
We cannot take off from the ground.

a small endangered sea bird who nests in old growth conifers, like the ancient redwoods.

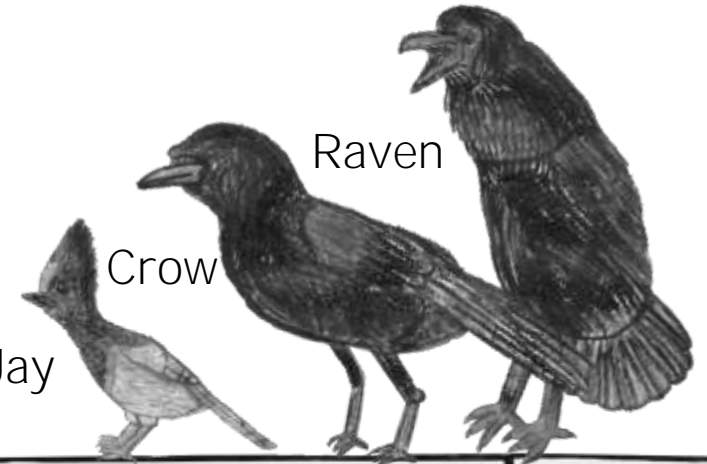
I dive deep to catch my food.

Too many corvids mean my eggs and chicks are less likely to survive.

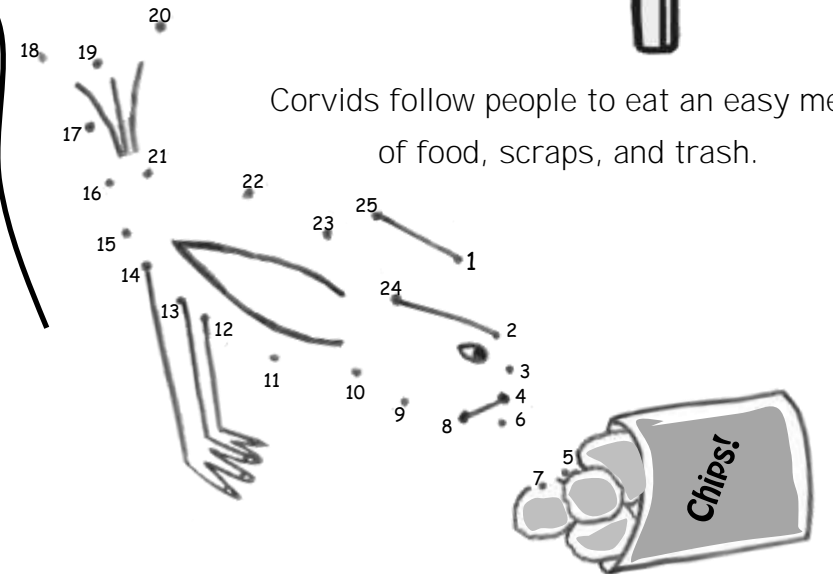
