



What is a Land Trust?



A land trust is a non-profit charitable organization dedicated to the long-term protection of natural and/or cultural heritage.



How Does a Land Trust Conserve Land?

A) Through a conservation covenant:

A covenant is a legal agreement between a landowner and an authorized land trust, which remains attached to the title of land in perpetuity and defines allowable and restricted uses for the property.

B) Through land purchases and donations:

Land can be donated to or purchased by a land trust. Some transfers come with various tax incentives for landowners.
